Congratulations to the students who made the effort to compete in the poster section of the Science Talent Search.

This year 216 posters were entered with 128 from upper primary and 88 from the lower primary. Of those students who entered in the lower primary section eight received a mayor bursary and twelve received a minor bursary. In upper primary twelve received a mayor bursary and seventeen received minors.

Students were asked to address one of the topics given – how different life would be if we had no moon, what do we see in the night sky, machines and space and changes in stars. The judges felt that most posters were well set out and presented a good understanding of the scientific content relating to the topic; they were impressed by the enthusiasm of the students and their understanding of the concepts presented on their posters.
